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PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDATE AND COMPLAINT FOR DECLARATORY RELIEF

sections 1085 and 1086 for a writ of mandate commanding respondent TIM DUPUIS, Registrar of Voters of Alameda County, and respondent MARK NUMAINVILLE, City Clerk for the City of Berkeley, to utilize the redistricting plan approved by the Berkeley City Council in Ordinance No. 7,320-N.S. for purposes of the November 2014 Municipal Election, even though the plan is subject to a referendum that has qualified for the November 4, 2014 ballot, in order to avoid violating the United States and California Constitutions and the Berkeley City Charter, and to provide certainty for voters, candidates, and elections officials. In addition, petitioner also requests a declaration from this Court pursuant to section 1060 of the Code of Civil Procedure that (1) the Berkeley City Council District boundaries adopted in 2002 in Ordinance No. 6,679-N.S. must not be used because they raise serious constitutional questions under the Equal Protection Clause of the United States and California Constitutions and fail to comply with the Berkeley City Charter, and (2) that Ordinance No. 7,320-N.S. must be used for purposes of the November 2014 Municipal Election.

Petitioner City of Berkeley petitions this Court pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure

By this petition, petitioner alleges:

- Petitioner CITY OF BERKELEY is a charter city located in the County of Alameda.
- 2. Respondent TIM DUPUIS is the Registrar of Voters of Alameda County and is sued in his official capacity.
- 3. Respondent MARK NUMAINVILLE is the City Clerk for the City of Berkeley and is sued in his official capacity.
- 4. Real party in interest MAX ANDERSON is a proponent of the referendum ("Referendum") challenging the redistricting plan approved by the Berkeley City Council ("City Council") in Ordinance 7,320-N.S. of the City of Berkeley ("City Council-approved Plan"), a true and correct copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 5. Real party in interest JESSE ARREGUÍN is a proponent of the Referendum challenging the redistricting plan approved by the City Council in Ordinance 7,320-N.S.
- 6. Real party in interest STEFAN ELGSTRAND is a proponent of the Referendum challenging the redistricting plan approved by the City Council in Ordinance 7,320-N.S.

- 7. Real party in interest PAUL KEALOHA BLAKE is a proponent of the Referendum challenging the redistricting plan approved by the City Council in Ordinance 7,320-N.S.
- 8. Real party in interest MATTHEW LEWIS is a proponent of the Referendum challenging the redistricting plan approved by the City Council in Ordinance 7,320-N.S.
- 9. Real party in interest STEPHANIE MIYASHIRO, is a proponent of the Referendum challenging the redistricting plan approved by the City Council in Ordinance 7,320-N.S.
- 10. Real party in interest PHOEBE SORGEN is a proponent of the Referendum challenging the redistricting plan approved by the City Council in Ordinance 7,320-N.S.
- 11. Real party in interest ALEJANDRO SOTO-VIGIL is a proponent of the Referendum challenging the redistricting plan approved by the City Council in Ordinance 7,320-N.S.
- 12. Real party in interest KRISS WORTHINGTON is a proponent of the Referendum challenging the redistricting plan approved by the City Council in Ordinance 7,320-N.S.
- NUMAINVILLE believes he has a ministerial duty to direct respondent DUPUIS to use the redistricting plan approved by the City Council in Ordinance No. 6,679-N.S. following the 2000 census (the "2002 Plan"), a true and correct copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B, for City Council elections in November 2014 because a group of Berkeley voters has collected enough signatures to qualify a Referendum against the City Council-approved Plan. The Berkeley City Charter ("Charter") provides that the qualification of the Referendum, which will be submitted to the voters at the November 2014 Municipal Election, stays the effective date of the City Council-approved Plan pending the outcome of the Referendum. This petition challenges respondent NUMAINVILLE's intention to direct respondent DUPUIS to use the boundaries drawn by the 2002 Plan in the November 2014 election, at which the voters will elect City Councilmembers in four of the City's eight districts.
- 14. Petitioner is informed and believes, and on that basis alleges, that respondent DUPUIS believes he has a ministerial duty to use the 2002 Plan provided to him by respondent NUMAINVILLE to conduct the November 2014 Municipal Election. This petition challenges

respondent DUPUIS's intention to use the boundaries drawn by the 2002 Plan which will be provided to him by respondent NUMAINVILLE in the November 2014 election.

- 15. The Equal Protection Clause of the United States Constitution requires that local districts be apportioned as equally as possible, conforming to the "one-person, one-vote" standard set out in *Reynolds v. Sims* (1964) 377 U.S. 533. (*Bd. of Estimate of City of New York v. Morris* (1989) 489 U.S. 688, 692.) The one-person, one-vote standard is also guaranteed by the California Constitution. (Cal. Const., art. I, § 7(a).)
- 16. Article V, section 9 of the Charter requires that the district boundaries of the City Council districts be adjusted following each decennial census. Following the 2010 census, City staff initiated the decennial redistricting process in 2011.
- 17. On January 17, 2012, the City Council voted to defer the submission of a new redistricting plan until after the November 2012 election in order to place a Charter amendment on the November 2012 ballot to establish new criteria for modifying district boundaries. On June 26, 2012, at its Regular Meeting, the City Council voted to put the Charter amendment on the November 2012 ballot. On November 6, 2012, Berkeley voters approved the Charter amendment, Measure R, by a margin of 65.92 percent to 34.08 percent, nearly a two-thirds supermajority of City voters. A true and correct copy of Measure R is attached hereto as Exhibit C.
- 18. Prior to the passage of Measure R, article V, section 9 of the Charter stated that adjustments to the City Council district boundaries "shall preserve, to the extent possible, the Council districts originally established herein . . ." Council districts were first drawn under the old article V, section 9 in 1986.
- 19. Measure R amended article V, section 9 of the Charter to eliminate the requirement that any adjustments to the City Council boundaries preserve, to the extent possible, the 1986 districts authorized by the City Council. Measure R also established new criteria for the formation of City Council districts. Namely, Measure R provided that:

the Council shall ensure that the districts continue to be as nearly equal in population as may be according to the census, taking into consideration topography, geography, cohesiveness, contiguity, integrity and compactness of territory of the districts, as well as existing communities of interest as defined in California Constitution

Article XXI, section 2(d)(4), and shall utilize easily understood district boundaries such as major traffic arteries and geographic boundaries to the extent they are consistent with communities of interest.

Thus, the voters rejected the previous City policy of preserving 1986-era districts to the extent possible, and commanded that the City Council instead consider other factors, such as existing communities of interest and easily understood boundaries like major traffic arteries and geographic boundaries.

20. With respect to the timing of decennial redistricting, article V, section 9 of the Charter states that:

[n]o later than December 31st of the third year following the year in which each decennial federal census is taken, commencing with the 2010 census, the Council shall by ordinance divide the City into eight Council districts. Any such redistricting shall become effective as of the next general election of Councilmembers immediately following the effective date of said ordinance.

Thus, the Charter requires the City Council to complete the redistricting process by the end of 2013 and to have new districts in place in time for the 2014 Municipal Election.

- 21. Following the passage of Measure R, the City Council approved a rigorous process and timeline for adjusting the City Council district boundaries in response to the 2010 census and in conformity with article V, section 9 of the Charter. The process included two community meetings, the submission of various plans by members of the public, and numerous City Council meetings where redistricting was discussed, all of which afforded an opportunity for the public to provide input to the City Council regarding the plans. The City Council's timeline called for all redistricting proposals, both from Councilmembers and from members of the public, to be submitted no later than March 15, 2013. In all, the City Council took up the topic of redistricting on at least ten occasions, during which time members of the public were given ample opportunity to submit their own plans and to provide feedback to the City Council on the plans that were presented.
- 22. On July 2, 2013, at a public hearing, after considering the submitted plans and receiving public input in accordance with the process it developed, the City Council directed staff to prepare an ordinance for adoption based on a plan submitted by the Berkeley Student District Campaign ("BSDC"). The BSDC is a coalition of students and community members who supported

the drawing of a majority-student district in the City and submitted such a plan to the City Council for its consideration. In accordance with the March 15, 2013 deadline for the submission of redistricting proposals, the BSDC submitted its plan on March 13, 2013 in the format established by the City Council.

- 23. On December 17, 2013, at the City Council's regularly scheduled meeting, the City Council adopted the BSDC plan, by a vote of 6-to-3, as Ordinance 7,320-N.S. of the City of Berkeley ("City Council-approved Plan"). The City Council-approved Plan reduced the deviation from the ideal district population, as calculated using the 2010 census, to less than one percent in all districts. In addition, the City Council-approved Plan created a district, Council District 7, which concentrated much of the City's large student population in a single district. Eighty-six percent (86 percent) of the voters in Council District 7 are student-aged, making it the first majority-student district in the country, according to the proponents.
- Councilmembers who voted against it, ¹ filed a referendum measure ("Referendum") challenging the City Council-approved Plan and submitted signatures to the Alameda County Registrar of Voters. ² These Councilmembers favored a plan that would have created a majority-student district with students comprising ninety percent (90 percent) of the district's population, four percent more than the student district included in the City Council-approved Plan. Unlike the City Council-approved Plan, which was submitted two days before the March 15, 2013 deadline for submission of redistricting proposals, the plan favored by the three dissenting members of the City Council was not proposed until months after that date and was not presented to the City Council until September 10, 2013, nearly six months after the deadline had passed. Consequently, unlike the City Council-approved Plan, the plan favored by the three dissenting members was not considered during the lengthy public process developed in response to the passage of Measure R. The City Council voted to reject this plan.

¹ The three City Councilmembers who voted against the City Council-approved Plan are Max Anderson, Jesse Arreguín, and Kriss Worthington.

² A true and correct copy of the Referendum petition is attached hereto as Exhibit D.

25. The supporters of the Referendum have not claimed that the City Council-approved Plan raises constitutional concerns or that it would violate the Berkeley City Charter. Instead, they contend that their plan is better because it creates a student district comprising more students (90 percent) than the City Council-approved Plan (86 percent).

- 26. Article XIV, section 93 of the Charter requires that a proposed referendum measure be signed by at least 10 percent of the voters who cast a ballot for all candidates for Mayor at the last general municipal election at which a Mayor was elected in order to be presented to the City Council. The threshold for sufficiency for the Referendum at issue here is 5,275 valid signatures.
- 27. On February 3, 2014, respondent DUPUIS verified that the Referendum had received sufficient signatures to qualify the Referendum. On the following day, respondent NUMAINVILLE certified the sufficiency of the petition and submitted it to the City Council, which was required pursuant to article XIV, section 93, to either repeal the Council Plan or submit it to the voters. Under the same Charter section, the presentation of the Referendum to the City Council stays the effective date of the City Council-approved Plan pending the outcome of the Referendum.
- 28. On March 11, 2014, by a vote of 6-to-3, the City Council voted to submit the Referendum to the voters. The City Council had originally considered the Referendum during its Regular Meeting of February 25, 2014, but opted to continue the matter until the next meeting, which occurred on March 11, 2014, so that it could adequately consider the alternatives. Because the deadline under the City Charter for placing a referendum on the June 2014 ballot was March 7, 2014, the Referendum was placed on the November 2014 ballot.
- 29. Berkeley voters will consider the Referendum at the General Election to be held on November 4, 2014. On the same day, Berkeley voters will elect representatives from City Council Districts 1, 4, 7, and 8.
- 30. As a result, respondent NUMAINVILLE is in a bind. A small minority of Berkeley voters have, by virtue of the qualification of the Referendum, stayed the City Council-approved Plan, a plan which was approved by a majority of the City Council and which adheres to the redistricting criteria which were approved by nearly two-thirds of Berkeley voters. The only other City

Council-approved boundaries that are available to the City Clerk are the lines approved pursuant to the 2002 Plan.

- 31. Petitioner is informed and believes, and on that basis alleges, that respondent NUMAINVILLE intends to direct the Alameda County Registrar of Voters to use the boundaries drawn by the 2002 Plan for City Council elections in the City of Berkeley for the November 2014 election because the qualification of the Referendum has stayed the effective date of the City Council-approved Plan.
- 32. Petitioner is informed and believes, and on that basis alleges that respondent DUPUIS will comply with respondent NUMAINVILLE's direction and conduct the November 2014 Municipal Election using the boundaries drawn by the 2002 Plan.
- result of changes in population, the 2002 boundaries are now malapportioned. Based on the 2010 census, the ideal district population in each of the City of Berkeley's eight City Council districts is 14,073. But if the 2002 Plan were used in the 2014 election, the 2002 Plan would have a total population deviation of 27.8 percent and many of the districts would deviate sharply from the ideal district population. For instance, Council District 7 is currently overpopulated with a population of 16,623, a deviation of 18.1 percent from the ideal population. By contrast, Council District 5 is currently underpopulated with a population of 12,709, a deviation of 9.7 percent. Only one district, Council District 2, would deviate less than 5 percent from the ideal population. The United States and the California Supreme Courts have recognized that any population deviation over 10 percent is constitutionally suspect, while any deviation exceeding 16.4 percent may be "patently unconstitutional." (*Vandermost v. Bowen* (2012) 53 Cal.4th 421, 472-474.) The following chart illustrates the population deviation numbers of all eight City Council districts under the 2002 Plan:

34. By contrast, the City Council-approved Plan materially conforms to the ideal district population revealed by the 2010 census. All eight of the districts drawn by the City Council-approved Plan have populations that are within 1 percent of the ideal population of 14,073 and the total population deviation of the City Council-approved Plan is just 1.5 percent. The most populated district, Council District 5, has a total population of 14,182, a deviation of just 0.77 percent from the ideal. The most underpopulated district, Council District 6, has a total population of 13,966, a deviation of just 0.76 percent from the ideal. The following chart illustrates the population deviation numbers for all eight City Council districts under the City Council-approved Plan:

35. The use of the 2002 Plan would violate the "one-person, one-vote" standard of the Equal Protection Clauses of the United States and California Constitutions and would violate article V, section 9 of the Charter, which requires that districts be drawn as nearly equal in population as possible according to the most recent census. The City Council-approved Plan conforms to the requirements of article V, section 9.

36. The 2002 Plan, by contrast, was not drawn to conform to the newly-revised article V, section 9. It was drawn to conform to the superceded version of the Charter section, which required that redistricting plans maintain the 1986-era boundaries as much as possible. In addition to being based on criteria that have become obsolete, the 2002 Plan is based on data that is now obsolete.

The 2002 Plan used the now-outdated 2000 census data, as opposed to the City Council-approved Plan, which used the data generated by the most recent census in 2010.

- 37. For these reasons, the City must use the City Council-approved Plan to conduct the 2014 election given that the alternative would be to use a 12-year-old map with malapportioned districts and which fails to comply with the 2012 amendments to the City Charter.
- 38. Code of Civil Procedure section 1086 requires that a "writ must be issued in all cases where there is not a plain, speedy, and adequate remedy, in the ordinary course of law." Petitioner is informed and believes that respondent NUMAINVILLE intends to direct the use of the 2002 Plan for the November 2014 elections in the City of Berkeley. Petitioner is further informed and believes that respondent DUPUIS will comply with this direction and use the boundaries provided by respondent NUMAINVILLE to conduct the 2014 election. Consequently, there is no plain, speedy, or adequate legal remedy in the ordinary course of law for preventing the use of a district map which violates article V, section 9 of the Charter and raises serious questions under the Equal Protection Clauses of the United States and California Constitutions.
- 39. The rights of the voters of the City of Berkeley will be irreparably injured if the 2002 Plan is used during the 2014 election because they will be denied the equally apportioned districts guaranteed to them by the Charter and the "one-person, one-vote" standard set out by the United States Constitution. The City Council-approved Plan satisfies the "one-person, one-vote" standard and the newly adopted redistricting criteria that were overwhelmingly approved by voters through passage of the Charter amendment. Furthermore, the City Council-approved Plan, unlike the plan favored by the three dissenting Councilmembers, is the product of a thoughtful public process that was designed by the City Council in order to effectuate the new redistricting criteria and satisfies the Charter-conferred requirement that new boundaries be in place for the 2014 Municipal Election. Use of the 2002 Plan at the 2014 election would subordinate the preferences expressed by nearly two-thirds of Berkeley voters who voted in favor of the Charter amendment and two-thirds of their elected representatives who voted in favor of the City Council-approved Plan to the desires of a small group of voters who signed the Referendum and the three City Councilmembers who oppose the plan.

 Moreover, it would subordinate the more specific provisions of article V, section 9 of the Charter,

which specifically address redistricting, to the more general Charter provisions relating to referenda contained in article XIV, section 93 of the Charter. Lastly, use of the 2002 Plan would leave the City vulnerable to a legal challenge by a citizen that the redistricting plan being used by the City violates the Equal Protection Clauses of the federal and California Constitutions and the Berkeley City Charter, an action which could lead to further disruption, uncertainty, and costs.

- 40. The California Supreme Court, on two occasions, has been confronted by a referendum which stayed the effective date of a redistricting plan adopted by the designated redistricting body. On both occasions, the Court ordered that the plan adopted by the designated redistricting body be used for elections in the interim period before the referendum was decided. (*Vandermost*, *supra*, 53 Cal.4th 421; *Assembly v. Deukmeijian* (1982) 30 Cal.3d 638.) Petitioner seeks the same relief here.
- 41. Petitioner City of Berkeley has a beneficial interest in ensuring that its voters have certainty in preparing for the November elections, that its elections are conducted in conformity with its Charter, and that they are conducted in conformity with the United States and California Constitutions.
- 42. An actual controversy exists over the boundaries to be used in conducting City Council elections in the City of Berkeley in November 2014. In the absence of an order from this Court, respondent NUMAINVILLE will direct respondent DUPUIS to use the 2002 Plan in the November 2014 election. Petitioner believes that use of the 2002 Plan would violate article V, section 9 of the Berkeley City Charter and the Equal Protection Clauses of the United States and California Constitutions.
- 43. Petitioner desires a judicial declaration that the 2002 Plan, as applied to the current population of the City of Berkeley as reported by the 2010 census, raises serious constitutional questions under the Equal Protection Clauses of the United States and California Constitutions and violates the Berkeley City Charter, and that the boundaries drawn by the City Council-approved Plan must be used for City Council elections in the City of Berkeley in November 2014. The declaration is necessary at this time so that City and County elections officials have clarity and certainty as they

begin to prepare to conduct these elections, and so that candidates and voters may begin to prepare for their campaigns for these offices.

44. Issuance of the writ will further the goal of providing certainty to elections officials who are beginning to conduct pre-election activities relating to the November 2014 election and will not substantially interfere with the conduct of the 2014 election. The Alameda County Registrar of Voters needs to know which boundaries to use for the November election by April 30, 2014, which affords sufficient time to consider the relief sought by the Petitioner.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

(Writ of Mandate - Code of Civil Procedure, §§ 1085, 1086)

- 45. Petitioner realleges and incorporates by reference as if fully set forth herein the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 44 above.
- 46. Code of Civil Procedure sections 1085 and 1086 permit a court to issue a writ of mandate to compel the performance of an act which the law specifically enjoins, as a duty resulting from an office. Use of the 2002 Plan for City Council elections in the City of Berkeley in 2014 would violate article V, section 9 of the Berkeley City Charter and raise serious questions under the Equal Protection Clauses of the United States and California Constitutions.
- 47. Petitioner does not have a plain, speedy, and adequate remedy in the course of the law because, in the absence of a writ, respondent NUMAINVILLE will instruct respondent DUPUIS to use the boundaries drawn by the 2002 Plan for the 2014 election.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

Declaratory Relief

- 48. Petitioner realleges and incorporates by reference as if fully set forth herein the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 47 above.
- 49. An actual controversy exists over the boundaries to be used in City Council elections in the City of Berkeley in the November 2014 election. Respondent NUMAINVILLE intends to direct respondent DUPUIS to use the boundaries drawn by the 2002 Plan for the 2014 election. Petitioner contends that the use of such districts, as applied to the City's current population, would raise serious constitutional questions under the Equal Protection Clauses of the United States

and California Constitutions and violate article V, section 9 of the Berkeley City Charter, and that the City Council-approved Plan must be used for the 2014 election.

WHEREFORE, petitioner prays:

- That this Court issue a writ prohibiting respondents NUMAINVILLE and 1. DUPUIS from using the 2002 Plan as boundaries for the 2014 Municipal Election in the City of Berkeley, and directing respondents to use the City Council-approved Plan for the 2014 election.
- 2. For a declaration from this Court that the boundaries drawn by the 2002 Plan, as applied to the current population of the City of Berkeley as reported by the 2010 census, raise serious constitutional questions under the Equal Protection Clauses of the United States and California Constitutions, and fail to comply with article V, section 9 of the Berkeley City Charter, and that Ordinance 7,320-N.S. of the City of Berkeley must be used for City Council elections in the City of Berkeley pending the outcome of a referendum petition against the ordinance; and
 - For such other and further relief as the Court deems just and equitable. 3.

ORDINANCE NO. 7,320-N.S.

AUTHORIZING THE ADJUSTMENT OF BERKELEY CITY COUNCIL DISTRICT BOUNDARIES PURSUANT TO SECTION 9, ARTICLE V OF THE BERKELEY CITY CHARTER, TO EQUALIZE POPULATION IN THE DISTRICTS AS A RESULT OF POPULATION CHANGES REFLECTED IN THE 2010 DECENNIAL FEDERAL CENSUS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Berkeley as follows:

Section 1. Purpose.

In order that the eight City Council Districts shall continue to be nearly equal in population as may be according to said 2010 Decennial Federal Census, the City Council Districts are hereby adjusted as set forth in Section 2.

Section 2. District Boundaries.

FIRST COUNCIL DISTRICT shall comprise all of that portion of the City of Berkeley included in the following 2010 Census Tract and Block numbers:

Section 3. Effective date of Adjustments.

The district boundaries established herein shall govern the election of Councilmembers beginning with the November 4, 2014 General Municipal Election.

Section 4. Posting.

Copies of this Bill shall be posted for two days prior to adoption in the display case located near the walkway in front of Old City Hall, 2134 Martin Luther King Jr. Way. Within fifteen days of adoption, copies of this Ordinance shall be filed at each branch of the Berkeley Public Library and the title shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation.

ORDINANCE NO. 6679-N.S.

AUTHORIZING THE ADJUSTMENT OF BERKELEY CITY COUNCIL DISTRICT BOUNDARIES PURSUANT TO SECTION 9, ARTICLE V OF THE BERKELEY CITY CHARTER, TO EQUALIZE POPULATION IN THE DISTRICTS AS A RESULT OF POPULATION CHANGES REFLECTED IN THE 2000 DECENNIAL FEDERAL CENSUS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Berkeley as follows:

Section 1. Purpose.

In order that the eight City Council Districts shall continue to be nearly equal in population as may be according to said 2000 Decennial Federal Census, the City Council Districts originally established by the Berkeley City Charter amendment at the Berkeley Special Municipal Election on June 3, 1986, are hereby adjusted as set forth in Section 2.

Section 2. District Boundaries.

FULL TEXT OF CHARTER AMENDMENT

CHARTER AMENDMENT TO ALLOW CITY COUNCIL TO ADOPT DECENNIAL REDISTRICTING PLAN

The People of the City of Berkeley hereby amend the following sections of the Charter of the City of Berkeley to read as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Section 9 of Article V of the Charter of the City of Berkeley is amended to read as follows:

Section 9. Election and Districts.

- (a) The Mayor, Auditor and School Directors shall be elected at the general municipal election on a general ticket from the City at large.
- (b) The Councilmembers shall be elected at the general municipal election by districts. The Councilmembers shall be recalled by districts.
- (c) No later than December 31st of the third year following the year in which each decennial federal census is taken, commencing with the 2010 census, the Council shall by ordinance divide the City into eight Council districts. Any such redistricting shall become effective as of the next general election of Councilmembers immediately following the effective date of said ordinance.
- (1) In establishing and modifying district boundaries, the Council shall ensure that the districts continue to be as nearly equal in population as may be according to the census, taking into consideration topography, geography, cohesiveness, contiguity, integrity and compactness of territory of the districts, as well as existing communities interest as defined in California Constitution Article XXI, section 2(d)(4), and shall utilize easily understood district boundaries such as major traffic

arteries and geographic boundaries to the extent they are consistent with communities of interest.

(2) Notwithstanding the foregoing paragraph, no change in the boundary or location of any district by redistricting may result in the residences of two sitting Council members being located in the same district.

The City is hereby divided into eight Council districts as hereinafter set forth, and, commencing with the general municipal election in November, 1986 and continuing thereafter until new districts are established as hereinafter set forth, such districts shall be used for the election and recall of Councilmembers and for filling any vacancy in the office of Councilmember by appointment. If and when new districts are established, as hereinafter provided, such new districts shall be used for the aforesaid purposes; provided, however, that no change in the boundary or location of any district by redistricting as herein provided shall operate to abolish or terminate the term of office of any Councilmember for which such Councilmember was elected or appointed. The eight Council districts, as established herein, shall be bounded and described as follows: FIRST COUNCIL DISTRICT shall comprise all of that portion of the City of Berkeley commencing on the point at the center of the intersection of University Avenue and Grant-Street, thence northerly along the center line of Grant-Street to the center of the intersection of Vine Street; thence westerly along the center line of Vine Street to the center of the intersection of Vine Street and Edith Street; thence northerly along the center line of Edith Street to the center of the intersection of Edith Street and Rose Street; thence westerly along the center line of Rose Street to the center of the intersection of Rose Street and Sacramento Street; thence northerly along the center line of Sacramento Street to the center of the intersection of Sacramento Street and Hopkins Street; thence easterly along the center line of Hopkins Street to the center of the intersection of Hopkins Street and Hopkins Court; thence westerly along the center line of Hopkins Court to the center of the intersection of Hopkins Court and Albina Avenue; thence northerly along the center line of Albina Avenue to the northern boundary line of the City of Berkeley; thence westerly along said northern boundary line to the western boundary line of the City of Berkeley in the San Francisco Bay; thence southerly along said western boundary line to where it intersects with a line which is a direct extension of the center line of University Avenue; thence easterly along said extension line and along the center line of University Avenue to the point of beginning.

SECOND COUNCIL DISTRICT shall comprise all of that portion of the City of Berkeley commencing on the point on the western boundary line of the City of Berkeley in the San Francisco Bay where an extension of the center line of University Avenue would intersect said western boundary line; thence southerly along said western boundary line to the Southern boundary line of the City of Berkeley; thence easterly along said southern boundary line to the intersection of said southern boundary line and the center line of California Street; thence northerly along the center line of California Street to the center of the intersection of California Street and Ashby Avenue; thence westerly along the center line of Ashby Avenue and Sacramento Street; thence northerly along the center line of Sacramento Street to the center of the intersection of Sacramento Street to the center of the intersection of Sacramento Street to the center of the intersection of Sacramento Street and University Avenue; thence westerly

along the center line of University Avenue, and along an extension of said center line, to the point of beginning.

THIRD COUNCIL DISTRICT shall comprise all of that portion of the City of Berkeley commencing on the point where the southern boundary line of the City of Berkeley intersects the center line of California Street; thence easterly along said southern boundary line to the intersection of said southern boundary line and the center line of Deakin Street; thence northerly along the center line of Deakin Street to the center of the intersection of Deakin Street and Ashby Avenue; thence easterly along the center line of Ashby Avenue and Ellsworth Street; thence northerly along the center line of Ellsworth Street to the center of the intersection of Ellsworth Street and Dwight Way; thence westerly along the center line of Dwight Way to the center of the intersection of Dwight Way and Sacramento Street; thence southerly along the center line of Sacramento Street to the center of the intersection of Sacramento Street and Ashby Avenue; thence easterly along the center line of Ashby Avenue and California Street; thence southerly along the center line of California Street to the point of beginning.

FOURTH COUNCIL DISTRICT shall comprise all of that portion of the City of Berkeley commencing on the point at the center of the intersection of Ellsworth Street and Dwight Way; thence northerly along the center line of Ellsworth Street to the center of the intersection of Ellsworth Street and Channing Way; thence westerly along the center line of Channing Way to the center of the intersection of Channing Way and Fulton Street; thence northerly along the center line of Fulton Street to where it becomes Oxford Street and continuing along the center line of Oxford Street to the center of the intersection of Oxford Street and Hearst Avenue; thence easterly along the center line of Hearst Avenue to the center of the intersection of Hearst Avenue, Arch Street and Le Conte Avenue; thence northerly along the center line of Arch Street to the center of Arch Street and Cedar Street; thence westerly along the center line of Cedar Street to the center of the intersection of Cedar Street and Spruce Street; thence northerly along the center line of Spruce Street to the center of the intersection of Spruce Street and Vine Street; thence westerly along the center line of Vine Street to the center of the intersection of Vine Street and Martin Luther King Jr. Way; thence southerly along the center line of Martin Luther King Jr. Way to the intersection of Martin Luther King Jr. Way and Cedar Street; thence westerly along the center line of Cedar Street to the center of the intersection of Cedar Street and Grant Street; thence southerly along the center line of Grant Street to the center of the intersection of Grant Street and University Avenue; thence westerly along the center line of University Avenue to the center of the intersection of University Avenue and Sacramento Street; thence southerly along the center line of Sacramento Street to the intersection of Sacramento Street and Dwight Way, thence easterly along the center line of Dwight Way to the point of beginning.

FIFTH COUNCIL DISTRICT shall comprise all of that portion of the City of Berkeley commencing on the point at the center of the intersection of Spruce Street and Vine Street; thence northerly along the center line of Spruce Street to the center of the intersection of Spruce Street and Grizzly Peak Blvd; thence northerly along the center

line of Grizzly Peak Blvd. to the northern boundary line of the City of Berkeley; thence westerly and thence southerly along said northern boundary line to the intersection of said boundary line with the center line of Albina Avenue; thence southerly along the center line of Albina Avenue to the center of the intersection of Albina Avenue and Hopkins Court; thence easterly along the center line of Hopkins Court to the center of the intersection of Hopkins Court and Hopkins Street; thence westerly along the center line of Hopkins Street to the center of the intersection of Hopkins Street and Sacramento Street; thence southerly along the center line of Sacramento Street to the center of the intersection of Sacramento Street and Rose Street; thence easterly along the center line of Rose Street to the center of the intersection of Rose Street and Edith Street; thence southerly along the center line of Edith Street to the center of the intersection of Edith Street and Vine Street; thence easterly along the center line of Vine Street to the center of the intersection of Vine Street and Grant Street; thence southerly along the center of Grant Street to the center of the intersection of Grant Street and Cedar Street; thence easterly along the center line of Cedar Street to the center of the intersection of Cedar Street and Martin Luther King Jr. Way; thence northerly along the center line of Martin Luther King Jr. Way to the center of the intersection of Martin Luther King Jr. Way and Vine Street; thence easterly along the center line of Vine Street to the point of beginning.

SIXTH COUNCIL DISTRICT shall comprise all of that portion of the City of Berkeley commencing on the point at the center of the intersection of Arch Street, Le Conte Avenue and Hearst Avenue; thence easterly along the center line of Hearst Avenue, and along a direct extension of the center line of Hearst Avenue, to the point where it intersects the boundary line of the campus of the University of California, which boundary line is also the boundary line of federal census tract number 4226, thence northerly, and thence easterly, along said boundary line to where it intersects the eastern boundary line of the City of Berkeley; thence northerly along said eastern boundary line to the intersection of said boundary line and the center line of Grizzly Peak Blvd.; thence southerly along the center line of Grizzly Peak Blvd. to the center of the intersection of Grizzly Peak Blvd. and Spruce Street; thence westerly and southerly along the center line of Spruce Street and Cedar Street; thence easterly along the center line of Cedar Street to the center of the intersection of Cedar Street and Arch Street; thence southerly along the center line of Arch Street to the point of beginning.

SEVENTH COUNCIL DISTRICT shall comprise all that portion of the City of Berkeley commencing at the point on the southern boundary line of the City of Berkeley where it intersects the center line of Deakin Street; thence easterly along said southern boundary line to the intersection of said southern boundary line and the center line of College Avenue; thence northerly along the center line of College Avenue to the center of the intersection of College Avenue and Ashby Avenue; thence westerly along the center line of Ashby Avenue and Benvenue Avenue; thence northerly along the centerline of Benvenue Avenue to the center of the intersection of Benvenue Avenue and Parker Street; thence easterly along the center line of Parker Street to the center of the intersection of Parker Street and College Avenue; thence northerly along the center line of College Avenue to the center

of the intersection of College Avenue and Bancroft Way; thence easterly along the center line of Bancroft Way to the center of the intersection of Bancroft Way, Piedmont Avenue and Gayley Road; thence northerly along the center line of Gayley Road to the center of the intersection of Gayley Road and Hearst Avenue; thence westerly along the centerline of Hearst Avenue and Oxford Street; thence southerly along the center line of Oxford Street to where it becomes Fulton Street and continuing southerly along the center line of Fulton Street to the center of the intersection of Fulton Street and Channing Way; thence easterly along the center line of Channing Way to the center of the intersection of Channing Way and Ellsworth Street; thence southerly along the center line of Ellsworth Street to the center of the intersection of Ellsworth Street and Ashby Avenue; thence westerly along the center line of Ashby Avenue to the center of the intersection of Ashby Avenue and Deakin Street; thence southerly along the center line of Deakin Street to the point of beginning.

EIGHTH COUNCIL DISTRICT shall comprise all of that portion of the City not otherwise described as constituting the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Council Districts.

The Council shall, by ordinance, adjust if necessary the boundaries of the Council districts herein set forth by December 31st of the third year following the year in which each decennial federal census is taken, commencing with the 2010 census, as provided and required in the Constitution and statutes of the State of California and in order that the eight Council districts shall continue to be as nearly equal in population as may be according to said census. Any such redistricting shall preserve, to the extent possible, the Council districts originally established herein and shall become effective as of the next general election of Councilmembers immediately following the effective date of said ordinance.

Commencing with the general municipal election in November 1986, e

(d) Each Councilmember shall be elected by the electors within a Council
district, must have resided in the District in which he or she is elected for a period of not
less than thirty days immediately preceding the date he or she files a declaration of
candidacy for the office of Councilmember, must continue to reside therein during his or
her incumbency, and shall be removed from office upon ceasing to be such resident.

(e) The candidate receiving the highest number of votes for the offices, respectively, of Mayor, Auditor and Councilmembers of the City shall be elected to such offices, provided that such candidate receives at least 40% of the votes cast for each such office. In the event that no candidate for Mayor, Auditor and Councilmember for one or more Council offices receives at least 40% of the votes cast for that office, then there shall be a runoff election between the two candidates receiving the most votes, which runoff election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in February of the odd numbered year following the initial election. No other issues shall appear on the ballot of any runoff election. The successful candidate in any runoff election shall assume office on March 1, after the election results have been declared

by the Council. If the provisions of Article III, Section 5, Paragraph 12 related to instant runoff voting are operative, the vote threshold requirements in this section shall have no application to municipal elections.

(f) Should any provision of the amendment of this section be held invalid, the remainder of this section the amendment shall not be affected thereby, and such word, phrase, sentence, part, section, subsection, or other portion shall be severable, and the remaining provisions of this section shall remain in full force and effect. The voters hereby declares that they would have passed this section and each subsection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases had been declared invalid.

<u>Section 2</u>. Section 5, subdivision 12 of Article III of the Charter of the City of Berkeley is amended to read as follows:

(12) Use of instant runoff voting in lieu of runoff elections.

For purposes of this charter "instant runoff voting" shall refer to a voting system which, in a single election, determines the candidate supported by the voters. Notwithstanding any section of this Charter to the contrary, upon a determination by the City Council of all of the following, that: a) the voting equipment and procedures are technically ready to handle instant runoff voting in municipal elections; b) instant runoff voting will not preclude the City from consolidating its municipal elections with the County; and c) instant runoff elections will not result in additional City election costs, the Council may by ordinance establish a system of instant runoff voting for the offices of Mayor, City Council, and Auditor in any manner permitted by the State of California Elections Code. Once the Council institutes a system of instant runoff voting, future elections shall be conducted as instant runoff voting elections, unless the Council finds that circumstances have changed such that one or more of the prior Council findings required by this section are no longer valid. In such case, the Council shall articulate the specific basis therefore in order to suspend an existing system of instant runoff voting. Subdivision (e) The fourteenth paragraph of Section 9 of Article V relating to the percentage threshold to trigger a runoff election shall have no application to a system of instant runoff voting. The City Clerk shall conduct voter and community education to familiarize voters with instant runoff voting.

We the undersigned voters of the city of Berkeley protest against the passage of Ordinance No. 7,320–N.S., which adopts the controversial City Council redistricting plan which divides neighborhoods and disenfranchises students, neighborhoods and progressives from having an equitable say in electing their city leaders.

Section 4. Posting

Copies of this Bill shall be posted for two days prior to adoption in the display case located near the walkway in front of Old City Hall, 2134 Martin Luther King Jr. Way. Within fifteen days of adoption, copies of this Ordinance shall be filed at each branch of the Berkeley Public Library and the title shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation.

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
