- Whereas, Sheila Quintana, an Oakland native, is herself a product of Oakland schools, graduating from McClymonds High School; and
- Whereas, Sheila Quintana has given freely of her own time, devoting her efforts to labor, community and education organizations, serving as a board member of the Marcus A. Foster Educational Institute in Oakland, a member of the Oakland Cross City Campaign for School Reform and the Western Regional Director of the Connectional Lay Council of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church; and
- Whereas, Sheila Quintana's outstanding leadership has earned her many awards and much recognition, including 2001 Exceptional Educator of the Year Award from the California Lottery, the California State Assembly's 2001 Exceptional Educator of the Year Resolution and the Public Education Service Award from the Alameda County Board of Education and the Alameda County Superintendent of Schools.
